## **Minister of Health Donville Inniss to be Guest Speaker at Upcoming Errol Barrow Memorial Dinner**



Now named The Errol Barrow Memorial Dinner, this annual dinner is both our principal fundraiser and an event that memorializes the Right Excellent Errol Walton Barrow, DLP founder and 1<sup>st</sup> Prime Minister of Barbados. Being held on Saturday, September 18<sup>th</sup> at the Delta Toronto East Hotel, this year's dinner will feature Barbados' Minister of Health, the Hon. Donville Inniss, M.P. as guest speaker.

Regarded by some as the best Health minister Barbados has had to date, Minister Inniss was appointed in 2009 and oversees a portfolio that accounts for 15% of Barbados's annual budget and includes the Queen Elizabeth Hospital, Psychiatric Hospital, Drug Service, Polyclinics, District Hospitals and Outpatient Clinics.

Holder of a Bachelor of Science Degree in Public Administration and a Masters degree in Business Administration from the University of the West Indies, Cave Hill, Minister Inniss has held a number of corporate executive positions and worked in several capacities both in Barbados and abroad with the Barbados Investment and Development Corporation. Mr. Inniss' business career also includes being Deputy Commissioner-General for Barbados at Taejon, South Korea in 1993.

He has also been actively involved in community work as a Member/Treasurer of the Democratic Labour Party, Public Relations Officer and Vice-President of the Barbados Youth Council and Youth Representative on the Board of Directors of the Barbados Family Planning Association. He has hosted a number of radio programmes for youth on local stations and is a past President of the Rotary Club of Barbados West.

Born, raised and educated in Barbados Ovid Herbert is a graduate of the Samuel Jackman Prescod Polytechnic in Barbados. After relocating to Toronto he studied at Ryerson University and graduated in 1985 with an Honours degree in Architectural Technology.

He began his business career as an estimator and project coordinator for interior construction and millwork projects.
